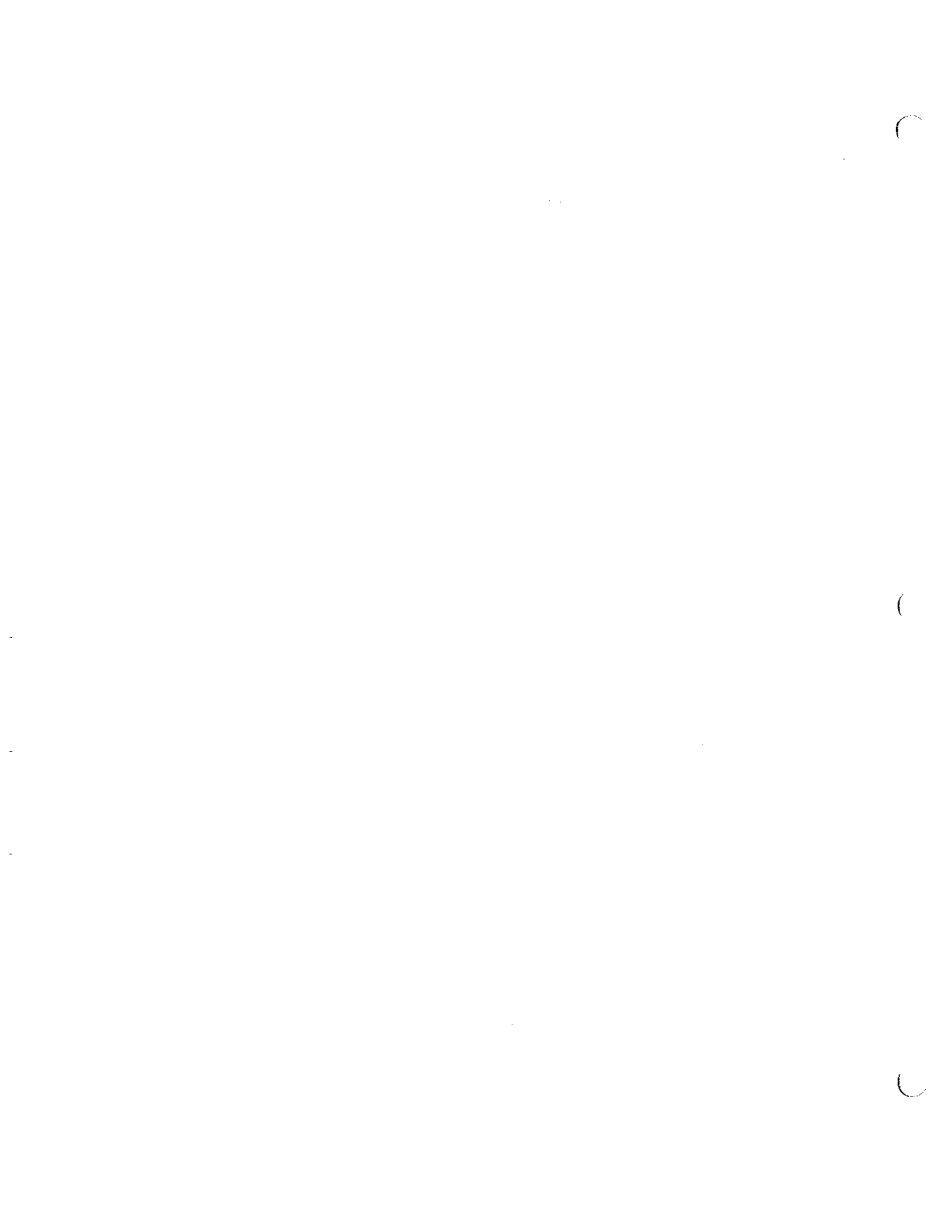

RE General Election Report

The City of Taneytown held its General Election on May 6, 2019 for the purpose of electing a Mayor and two (2) City Councilmembers. The result of this election was the following three (3) individuals receiving most votes, Bradley Wantz, Daniel Haines and Darryl Hale and thus winning the election.

### Election Details

The following information is a synopsis of the voting details of this election. The voter registration of the City of Taneytown as provided by the Carroll County Board of Elections was a total of 4,405 individuals listed as active voters.

The vote totals were as follows:

### Election Equipment and Personnel

The election was held using the voting machines provided by Electec. Absentee ballots were administered pursuant to the terms contained in the City Code of the City of Taneytown. The personnel manning the polls during the election were the following members of the Board of

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Election Supervisors: Chairwoman Dorothy Rue, Vice Chairman Barbara Heltebridle, Marvin Flickinger, William (Bill) Kennedy and Judy Furbay. The election was administered on behalf of the Board of Election Supervisors pursuant to Section C-502(b) of the City Charter by the City Clerk Clara Kalman. A representative from Electec was also present in the polls throughout the day to assist with use of the voting machines. The City Attorney, Jack Gullo Jr., and various members of the Taneytown Police Department also assisted the Board of Supervisors of Election when requested.

### **Election Day Occurrences**

All in all the Board believes this election went smoothly with little problems. There were minor issues with a few voters not understanding how to operate the voting machines, but this was easily resolved by the Electec technician and members of the Board of Elections explaining the electronic ballot.

The Board also noted that for the most part the poll watchers present complied with the rules and requirements thereof, but there were still incidents where there was talking to voters and use of cell phones.

It was also brought to the Board's attention that there was activity outside the poll in the no electioneering area where individuals were campaigning and when asked to relocate, they did so without issue.

### **Conclusion**

The Board of Supervisors of Elections considers it a privilege to serve the City and the democratic process in conducting the City Elections. A special thanks should be given to the City Clerk and members of the City Staff that did the preparation, administration and detail work which made this election possible. Finally, we would like to express our thanks to the members of the Taneytown Police Department for allowing us to use their facility and assisting in keeping order on Election Day.

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
